




Our Values – Community (Acts 2:42-47)

Our History



Community Bible Church of Weir, Texas was first organized in 1875 as the Prairie Springs Baptist Church. The congregation met at the school house where the old Weir School building stood. In 1886 the building was destroyed by a storm. There were 10 charter members in this organization.

The church and congregation reportedly moved several times and was eventually renamed Weir Baptist Church and then Weir First Baptist Church.

In 1890 a church house was built half a mile west of the church house on "B" Ranch. It was renamed Buffalo Springs Baptist Church from the skeleton of a buffalo head having been found on the property.





The congregation built a new building on South Main Street in Weir around 1975 and worshipped there until they built on five acres north of downtown Weir. The new building was built in the 2000's and is the current church site. The congregation renamed the church to Community Bible Church of Weir, Texas in 2021.

Our Theology*

About the Bible


- We believe the Bible is the Word of God, divinely inspired; it contains no errors in the original manuscripts and is preserved by God for us; it is authoritative for this church and each of us for every age.

About God

- We believe God exists eternally in three persons: God the Father, God the Son, and God the Spirit. These three are one God.
- We believe God created the universe by His Power and Word.
- We believe God is all-knowing, all-powerful, and ever present.

About Jesus Christ

- We believe Jesus Christ was sent by God the Father into the world to save sinners, He is the Second Person of the Trinity, and He is God the Son.
- We believe Jesus Christ was virgin born, sinless in life, and mighty in words and deeds.
- We believe Jesus was both God and man, He was crucified for our sins, and He was bodily raised from the dead. He then ascended to His Father's side where He is head of the church and intercedes for believers.
- We believe Jesus Christ is coming again personally, visibly, and bodily to reign as Lord.

About the Holy Spirit

- We believe the Holy Spirit the Third Person of the Trinity, is God the Spirit, and has all the divine characteristics of God. He indwells all believers, baptizes and seals them at the moment of salvation. He fills them in response to confession of sin and surrender to Him.

About Salvation

- We believe Jesus, through His death on the cross, provided salvation for all. However, to receive salvation one must repent of sin and trust Jesus Christ alone. The true believer is eternally secure and cannot lose their salvation. They may, however, lose their joy by sin and bring the loving discipline of the Father upon themselves.
- All who have received Christ will at death depart to be with Christ in their spirits and at Christ's return, receive a new body, which will be like His glorious body.



About the Church



- We believe a New Testament church is a local body of baptized believers who covenant to live transformed and transforming lives together to worship Jesus Christ, edify the believers, evangelize the lost, and minister to others.
- The church has two ordinances: Baptism and the Lord's Supper. Baptism symbolizes the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus Christ and the new life we have in Him. The Lord's Supper is a reminder of Christ's death and anticipates His Second Coming.

Accomplishments

Outreach

Community Bible Church is a church committed to reaching our community, and we have instituted several outreach programs that continue to grow in numbers and effectiveness of sharing the love of Christ.

- **Annual Fish Fry** – Our Fish Fry is held the week before Easter, and the community shows up! Over the last several years, the numbers have increased from around 300 to nearly 500, and they experience the love of Christ hear the Gospel message.
- **Kids Kamp** – This was our first year, and it was amazing! The majority of the kiddos were on scholarship, which is an amazing testimony to the generous hearts of all of our people.
- **Back to School Bash** – We reach families we would not otherwise reach through your generous school supplies contributions. It has become quite an event, and so many of you had crucial conversations with your neighbors.
- **Operation Christmas Child** – This was a banner year for OCC! We collected 1,639 shoeboxes, and our church packed 145 boxes at our first ever Pack and Pray Party. The number of you that brought shoeboxes, volunteered on collection days, contributed financially, and worked mightily is simply awe inspiring!
- **Wrapped** – Again, another first-time event, and it was at capacity. We were honored to have 96 ladies attend, and 17 men from our church served.
- **Angel Tree** – This is another first-time event for us, and church – you showed up! We served more than 30 families with 96 children. Well done!



In Reach

Our church continues to grow, not only in numbers but also in spiritual depth, serving, and carrying the message outside the church walls. The Lord is answering our prayer for generations to be a part of our fellowship. As the generations have arrived, you have stepped in and stepped up to minister to them.



- **Baptisms** – We have baptized 45 people over the last several years, and that is so far above the norm for a church our size. We are truly reaching people for Christ!
- **Attendance** – Attendance has increased by 374% over the last 4 years.
- **Children's Ministry** – Our Children's Ministry is growing, and we are so thankful for the leaders who stepped in to love on and disciple the kiddos.
- **Student Ministry** – We now have a Student Bible Study, and plans are in the works to expand Student Ministry with a weeknight service.

- **Women's Ministry** – There are two Women's group that meet. One meets Wednesday for Bible Study, exercise, and lunch. The other is a Sunday afternoon Bible Study. The ladies also have other events. And all these continue to grow and create the space for authentic relationships.
- **Men's Ministry** – The Men's group started this year, and it meets at Dale's on Tuesday evenings. The men also enjoyed Saturday Prayer Breakfast and several work days.
- **Elders** – The elders are actively meeting, and these open meetings have been well attended by church members and attenders. As always, all are welcome to attend.
- **Lunch with the Pastors** – Started last year, this is a monthly opportunity to fellowship, exchange ideas, and spend time exploring the future.

Service

The heart of any church is the volunteers, and oh how the Lord has answered our prayer for workers! We have been blessed by the number of people who have stepped in and stepped up to serve Christ through serving the church and the community.

- **Welcome Team** – The Welcome Team is the first exposure guests have with our little church, and they represent so well! They are assisting in the parking lot, helping people get to the right places, handing out information, and sharing smiles and love with all who enter!
- **Finance Team** – The Finance Team is protecting the integrity of the church, and they do so in the background. Their efforts have helped tighten up our processes, provide accountability, and bring confidence to how we steward your tithes and offerings.
- **Praise Team** – The Praise Team is growing, and it just keeps getting better. There are new faces using their gifts and talents to glorify the Lord, and we are all blessed by them.
- **Ministry Teams** – None of this would happen without people serving. We also see this in others stepping in to fill in as Bible Study leaders, Worship leaders, and even stepping into the pulpit! This, my friends, is the best sign of a healthy, growing church.
- **And All the Others** – There are so many of you who serve to provide breakfast, work in special events, do construction projects, repair items around the church, fold bulletins, move tables and chairs, and so on and so on. We couldn't do church without you!



Facilities


We are so blessed to have the facility we have. We have made a few changes, and there will be more to come as we feel some growing pains.

2026 Goals

Discipleship – 70%

This is a continuation from last year, and we are intent on meeting this goal. Community Bible Church is a church following the Great Commission to make disciples. As we grow, Small Groups is how we maintain the personal connection and the small church feeling. The goal is to have 70% of our people engaged in a small group. There are two settings in which you can participate in a small group:

- **Sunday Morning Bible Study** – We currently offer Sunday School for every age group from Pre-K through Senior Adults. These classes meet at 9:00 every Sunday morning.
- **Small Groups** – These groups meet on different nights of the week, and all are encouraged to find one that fits. We currently have several Women's Groups and a Men's Group that meet throughout the week.

Missions

Jesus commanded us to spread the Gospel from in our homes, to our neighborhoods, in our cities and towns, to our region, and to the ends of the earth (Matthew 28:19-20, Acts 1:8). We have placed a renewed focus and energy on missions and have developed plans and opportunities to help 100% of our members engage in missions.

- **Local missions** – In addition to supporting local mission works like The Caring Place and the Williamson County Pregnancy Help Center, we participate with Good Neighbors GTX in outreach to the community. We also recently began a relationship with Granger ISD, and this has been an awesome experience. We support teachers with supplies, students with health and study needs, and the staff with equipment and supplies.
- **Regional missions** – We hope to have at least two opportunities for Community Bible Church members to engage in regional (state and nationwide) missions such as Samaritan's Purse Humanitarian Aid Relief, Spring Break mission excursions, and outreach to indigenous communities.
- **International missions** – In the future, we will engage with an international mission organization.



Children and Student Ministry

Our next step for Children and Student Ministry is a ministry night. Many are familiar with programs such as AWANA, Disciple Now, and others, and we are working towards similar offerings.

Spanish Ministry

There is a desperate need in our community to reach our Spanish-speaking neighbors and friends. The reality is our church does not reflect the demographic of our community, and this is a weight we should all feel. We are currently testing AI translation platforms, and we are hopeful this will allow us to have something for everyone in our worship service. We also intend to add a Spanish, Sunday morning Bible Study as soon as we finish the Fellowship Hall remodel.

Senior Adult Ministry

Our Senior Adults are the spiritual and mentoring backbone of our church, and our community has many Seniors who want and need a connection. In 2026, we will plan for and engage Seniors in our church and our community through special events, game nights, and ministry opportunities.

Family Ministry

Our desire is to build a multi-generational family ministry that invests in children and parents, strengthens marriages and homes, and helps pass a vibrant, authentic faith from one generation to the next within the body of Christ. Our goal is to develop a family ministry that partners with parents as the primary disciplers of their children, equipping them with biblical resources, encouragement, and community so faith is nurtured both at home and within the life of the church.

Everyone Has a Place

One of our goals for 2026 is to find a place for everyone to serve. As you have heard Pastor Michael say, ***“The more you serve, the more you know God’s will.”*** (Romans 12:1-2). There are a variety of teams and opportunities to serve:

- Facilities maintenance and construction
- Logistics (set up and break down)

2026 Vision

Our vision for 2026 is to position Community Bible Church as a Christ-centered spiritual home and a hub of gospel influence for our growing community. We desire not simply to grow in number, but to grow in spiritual depth—faithfully proclaiming the Resurrected Christ and making disciples of all who come through our doors.



Growth

Our community is growing rapidly, and we believe we have only begun to see what God is doing. Thousands of homes are planned in the surrounding area, and families are already joining us from Jarrell, Granger, Bartlett, Jonah, Taylor, and Georgetown. God is clearly bringing people to this place.

With this growth comes both opportunity and responsibility. We are at a point where we must prayerfully consider what God is calling Community Bible Church to become in the years ahead. These are not merely logistical questions, but spiritual ones—questions about mission, stewardship, and faithfulness.

Decisions

As growth continues, we must prayerfully consider what lies ahead. Questions about facilities, property, and future expansion are not just practical matters; they are opportunities to trust God and to plan wisely for the ministry He has entrusted to us.

These conversations have begun among the elders, but they are ultimately a matter of prayer and discernment for our entire church family.

Finances

We also recognize a simple reality: ministry and growth require resources. Yet we trust the Lord who owns the cattle on a thousand hills and supplies all that is needed for His purposes.

One of our goals for 2026 is to strengthen and grow our Building Fund through designated giving. This fund exists to prepare for construction, renovation, facility improvements, and the future acquisition of property as God leads.

We are asking our church family and friends to prayerfully consider how they might participate—through faithful, joyful giving—in sowing into the future ministry and mission of Community Bible Church. This is not about buildings alone, but about creating space for people to encounter Christ, grow in faith, and be sent out in service.
